### EXECUTIVE ORDER NUMBER 23-96

(Extension of State Attorney Executive Assignment)

**WHEREAS**, the Honorable HAROLD F. PRYOR, State Attorney for the Seventeenth Judicial Circuit of Florida, was previously assigned by Executive Order 22-78 to the Eleventh Judicial Circuit of Florida to represent the State of Florida concerning allegations pending against Spencer Seton; and

**WHEREAS**, the Assigned State Attorney has advised the Governor that the duties required by the previous executive assignment have not yet been completed as the defendant has been found incompetent to proceed and was committed to a forensic treatment center. The next court date has been scheduled for April 25, 2023; and

**WHEREAS**, the Assigned State Attorney has further advised the Governor that an extension of this assignment is necessary in order to complete the assigned duties; and

**WHEREAS**, it is in the best interests of the State of Florida and of the ends of justice that the assignment of the Assigned State Attorney be continued with respect to the above matters, pursuant to section 27.14, Florida Statutes.

**NOW, THEREFORE, I, RON DESANTIS**, Governor of Florida, in obedience to my solemn constitutional duty to “take care that the laws be faithfully executed,” and pursuant to the Constitution and laws of the State of Florida, issue the following Executive Order:

Section 1. Executive Order 22-78 is reaffirmed and the executive assignment is extended for an additional period of one (1) year, to and including March 29, 2024.

Section 2. The Assigned State Attorney shall notify the Governor on or before February 29, 2024, if additional time is required.
