### EXECUTIVE ORDER NUMBER 11-06

(Emergency Management – Freezing Temperatures)

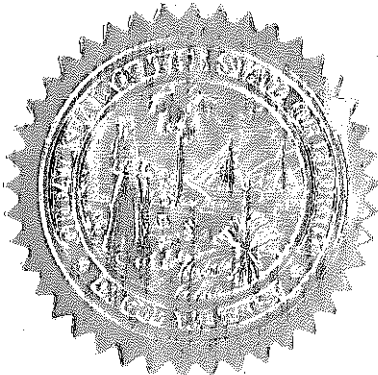
On December 10, 2010, Governor Crist issued Executive Order 10-262 declaring a state of emergency due to the threat that freezing temperatures posed to much of the State of Florida, and to ensure timely precautions were taken to protect Florida's agricultural interests. Because freezing weather continued over much of the state, Governor Crist issued Executive Order 10-275 extending the state of emergency for fourteen days through December 31, 2010, and Executive Order 10-283 extending the state of emergency for an additional seven days through January 7, 2011. Because the efforts to salvage freeze-damaged agricultural products continue in Florida, I am issuing this executive order to extend for an additional seven days a state of emergency to allow Florida's agricultural interests to continue to conduct salvage harvests of their crops.

As Governor, I am responsible to meet the dangers presented to this state and its people by this emergency. Therefore, by virtue of the authority vested in me by article IV, section 1(a) of the Florida Constitution and by the State Emergency Management Act, part I, chapter 252, Florida Statutes, and all other applicable laws, I promulgate the following Executive Order, to take immediate effect:

Section 1. Because of the foregoing conditions, I find that the continuation of the activities needed to harvest crops and transport them to processing plants without delay is of critical importance to the state's farming community and economy.

Section 2. I extend Executive Order 10-262 for seven (7) days through January

14, 2011.
